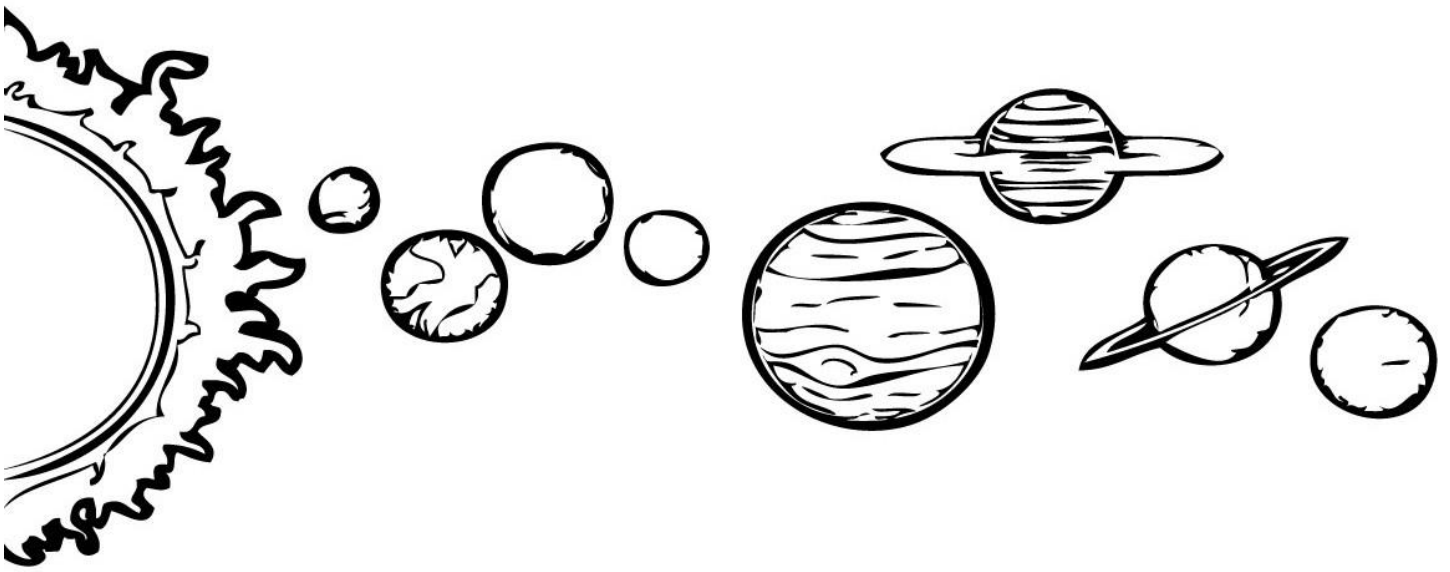


GOD is Our Creator & King

Also, we learn that God created everything out of nothing just by speaking His words.

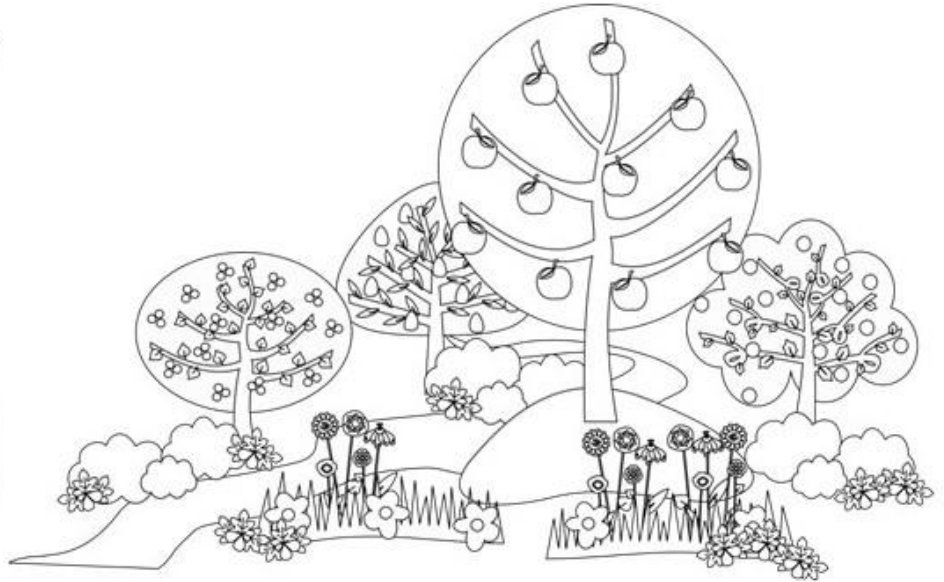


“And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good.”

"So God created human beings in his own image. In the image of God he created them; male and female he created them."-Genesis 1:27 NLT

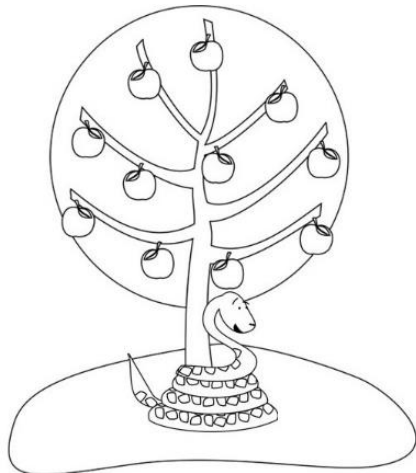


God Made the First Man and Woman: Adam and Eve

Genesis 2:22, "Then the Lord God made a woman. He made her from the rib he had taken out of the man. And the Lord God brought her to the man."



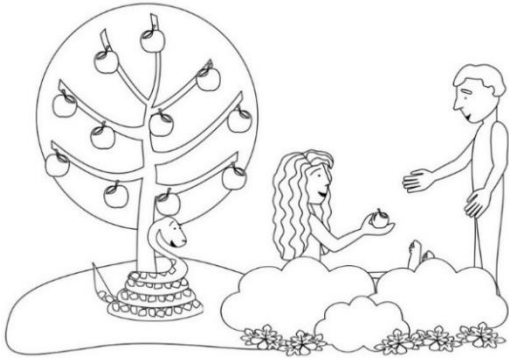
GOD's One Command

The First Temptation and Sin

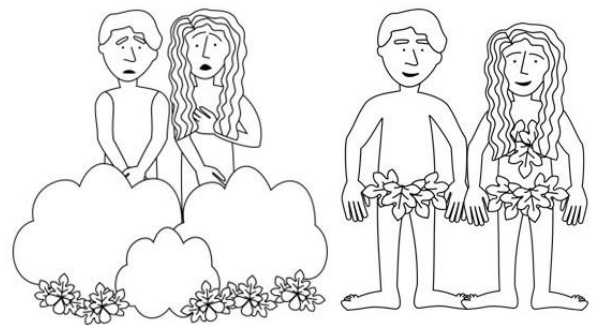


Genesis 3:1 NiRV

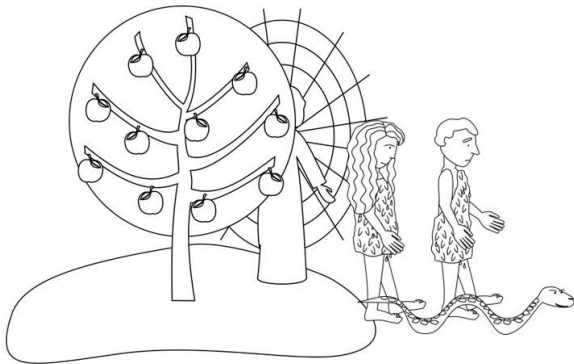
Genesis 3:6-7 NiRV
